CIVIL RIGHTS OVERVIEW

As with other Child Nutrition programs, sponsors of the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) must comply with Federal Civil Rights requirements. The Civil Rights requirements of the Program ensure that all SFSP participants benefit from the SFSP equally and without discrimination. Race, Color, National Origin, Sex, Age and Disability are the protected classes in the SFSP.

The same meals and meal components must be first served to all site participants on a first-come, first-served basis. This requirement ensures that site supervisors do not use personal preference to determine the order of service for participants. All meal site participants must also be allowed equal access to all available meal site facilities and services.

Other Civil Rights requirements for the sponsor include the required media release, collection of ethnicity and race data for potential and actual SFSP beneficiaries, posting the USDA Nondiscrimination Poster at the meal site(s) and sponsor office and including the USDA Nondiscrimination Statement, the procedure for filing a complaint, and the address for filing a complaint on all Program materials and information distributed to the public.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) publication FNS Instruction 113-1 discusses in greater detail, the Civil Rights requirements for the SFSP.
